4-H and Youth Development

Oldham County Stock Show: The Oldham County Stock Show takes place during the first weekend in January every year! This event serves as a culmination of the hard work and dedication of young people and livestock projects across the county. This year, the stock show was comprised of over 90 exhibitors from Oldham County 4-H, Adrian FFA, and Boys Ranch FFA.





Oldham County 4-H dominated in almost every category including Champion and Reserve Steer, Champion and Reserve Heifer, Champion Goat, Champion Sheep, and all Showmanship categories.

During the stock show, Oldham County 4-H students and parents operated the concession stand as a fundraiser for our Adult Leaders Fund. This fund allows us to fund District Contest entry fees for every 4-H member.

Fort Worth Stock Show: For some exhibitors in Oldham County, the county stock show is just the beginning of a long show season all over the state. The beginning of the State Major Shows is the Fort Worth Stock Show and Rodeo held at the Will Rogers Memorial Center in Fort Worth, TX. This year, 3 4-H members exhibited their projects at Fort Worth; Saige Martin, Brody Black, Hanna Gruhlkey. Saige came away with a 4th place heavy weight exotic steer and Hanna exhibited a 2nd Place ORB Heifer.
